**THE SUGGESTION REGARDING IN THE SUB PARA :-**

- 1 The Doctors in Public Health Institutions to be instructed to prescribe the Generic Drugs is a well appreciated step to make available the required medicine at cheaper rates. Hence the doctors working in the Govt. institution under the Health Department shall be instructed for the above said compliance .Moreover the Pvt. doctors too in the State through the Indian Medical Association shall also be advised to prescribe and use the Generic Drugs in the Public Interest and the Public may also through the print and electronic media be made aware regarding the cheap cost factor and equal effectiveness of Generic Drugs as compared to Branded Drugs .
- 2 State agrees with this proposal to prepare the list of essential drugs based on the national list of Essential Medicine and hence the said list shall be prepared accordingly.
- 3 The Procurement of Drugs has already been done through open tender system and the department is committed to follow the same in future as well.
- 4 Low cost Generic Drugs has already been distributed through Jan Aushdhi drugs stores running almost one in each district and also likely to be expanded further at sub division level in future.
- 5 The public shall be made aware through electronic media and print media regarding the cheap cost factor of the Generic Drugs and also their equal effectiveness in treating the diseases as compared to the Branded Drugs .Apart from this seminars ,lectures shall also be arranged at district and sub divisional headquarters to make aware the public regarding the subject and simultaneously telecasting the said programme through Cable Networking .

Subject :- Regarding implementation of clinical establishment (Registration and Regulation) Act,2010 in Punjab State.

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Govt.of India Ministry of Health and Family Welfare New Delhi in reference to their D.O. No.H.110113/4/2010-DFQC Dated 30<sup>th</sup> March 2011 to Principal Secretary Health and Family Welfare Punjab has requested to provide them a copy of the action plan along with implementation of clinical establishment (Registration and Regulation) Act,2010 in Punjab State. A meeting to discuss the Clinical Establishment Bill has been scheduled by Ministry of Govt.of India on 11<sup>th</sup> April 2011 with Punjab Govt.Health Department

**STATUS REGARDING IMPLEMENTATION OF CLINICAL ESTABLISHMENT (REGISTRATION AND REGULATION) ACT, 2010 IN PUNJAB STATE.**

Govt.of India vide their D.O.No.Z.28015/48/2000-H(PI-III) Dated 23<sup>rd</sup> Sept,2010 has informed that the clinical establishments (Registration and Regulation) Bill ,2010 , recently passed by both houses of Parliament , has received the assent of the President of India , and has been published in the Gazette of India on the 19<sup>th</sup> Aug, 2010 . Govt. of India desires full –fledged support from Punjab State to implement this Act in the larger Public Interest and this Act should be implemented in all States of the Country Uniformly.

In Punjab, Ministers Legislature has constituted Cabinet Sub Committee to examine, propose and recommend regarding Drafting of bill to regulate and register Private Hospitals / Nursing Homes / Dispensaries/Diagnosing Centres. Meetings of the Cabinet Sub Committee have been held in the year 2010 and 2011 to submit the decision regarding the implementation of **CLINICAL ESTABLISHMENT ACT.**

Members of Cabinet sub Committee are Minister of Health and Family Welfare, Minister of Medical Education and Research , Minister of Finance and Minister of Food and Supplies .

Committee desired that the States where this Act has been implemented, their Act should be studied and comparison Statement to be made between Govt. of India's Act and States Act . Action was taken and comparison statement was examined by the committee. Principal Secretary Health and Family Welfare Sh.Satish Chandra discussed that either Clinical Establishments Act 2010 of Govt.of India be adopted as such or Punjab Govt. can make its own Act . Punjab Govt. has launched its Rapid Response Team through Ambulance System. Through this Scheme every Road Side Accident Case has to be immediately shifted to nearest Hospital which may be a Pvt. Hospital .In spite of this
